

GLOBAL HIV EPIDEMIC

Professor Salim S. Abdool Karim is a clinical infectious diseases epidemiologist widely recognized for his contributions in HIV prevention and treatment. His contributions to microbicides for HIV prevention culminated in the CAPRISA 004 tenofovir gel trial which provided proofof-concept that antiretroviral drugs can prevent sexually transmitted HIV infection in women. He is the Director of the Centre for the AIDS Programme of Research in South Africa (CAPRISA) and Pro Vice-Chancellor (Research) at the University of KwaZulu-Natal in Durban, South Africa. He is also the CAPRISA Professor of Global Health at Columbia University and Adjunct Professor of Medicine at Weill Medical College of Cornell University, New York. He chairs the UNAIDS Scientific Expert Panel and the WHO HIV-Hepatitis Scientific and Technical Advisory Committee and serves on Advisory Board of the Gates Foundation as well as the WHO TB-HIV Task Force.
